## Domestic Violence Conference begins Wednesday

The Fourth Annual Rural Domestic Violence Conference will be held March 14-16 at the Milton H. Johnson Health Center on the campus of Chipola Junior College.

The conference begins at 8 a.m. on Wednesday and runs through Noon on Friday. Chipola's Department of Continuing Education is co-hosting the event with State Attorney Jim Appleman, Jackson County Sheriff John P. McDaniel and the Florida Coalition Against Domestic Violence.

The conference is expected to attract some 500 participants, including law enforcement officers, nurses, social workers and judges from across Florida. Reg-

istrations have also come in from Arkansas, New Jersey, Alabama, Georgia and Texas. Margie Williams, CJC director of

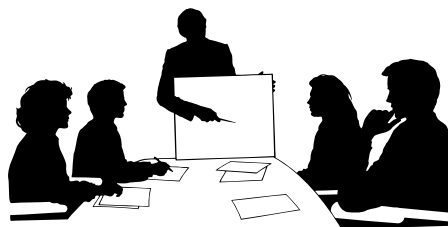
Continuing Education, reports that the meeting is the largest rural domestic violence conference in the U.S.

The keynote speaker will be Dr. Gaynell Colburn,

a physically challenged, wellness consultant, who works as a vocalist and percussionist for Bill Cosby and Stevie Wonder.

Colburn's motivational and educational programs for all ages have had tremendous success in at-risk communities, schools, colleges and rehab centers. She is a frequent presenter at national confer

## **Chipola to offer short courses**

Chipola Junior College will offer a variety of short courses during the month of March.

The Fourth Annual **Rural Domestic Violence Conference** will be held March 14-16 on the CJC campus. Chipola's Department of Continuing Education is co-hosting the event with State Attorney Jim Appleman, Jackson County Sheriff John P. McDaniel and the Florida Coalition Against Domestic Violence.

The following **computer courses** will be offered: **Excel II**, March 12 and 13; **Excel Introductory**, March 20 and 22; **Access I**, March 26 and 27.

All computer courses meet from 5:30 to 8:30 p.m. Cost of each course is \$45.

A **Fiber Optics Course** will meet March 26-29, from 8 a.m. to 4 p.m. The registration fee of \$1,100 includes books and materials.

A **Speed Reading** class will be offered. Times and costs will be announced at a later date.

A **40-Hour Insurance Pre-Licensing Home Study** course is available for \$295.

## **University Center @ Chipola adds UWF programs**

The University of West Florida is offering classes on Chipola's campus leading to Specialist and Doctoral degrees in Curriculum and Instruction.

Several CJC employees have completed Specialist degrees and some are beginning the Doctoral program.

Students are currently being accepted for the 2001 Summer term which begins in May. Students must have a Master's degree to enroll. The tentative course schedule is posted on the University Center's web page, [www.chipola.cc.fl.us](http://www.chipola.cc.fl.us) (click University Center, then Universities and Degrees). Persons interested in this program may call Dr. Kitty Myers at 718-2260, or Dr. Michael Barry, program director, at (850) 863-6538.

Chipola and UWF also have collaborated to begin a new Master's program in Educational Leadership with Administrative Certification beginning in May. UWF personnel will teach all courses on the CJC campus. The program consists of 36 hours. Two, three-hour courses will be offered each Summer, Fall, and Spring semester. Applicants must have

a Bachelor's degree and a teaching certificate. In addition, they must take the GRE by the time they have completed 15 hours in the program. Individuals who hold a Master's degree may be allowed to take courses as part of a Specialist program in Educational Leadership on the Fort Walton Beach campus.

The first course in the new Master's program, EDF 6211, Application of Psychological Theories to Current Issues in Student Development and Learning, will meet May 18-19 and June 1, 2, 8 and 9. The Friday classes meet from 5-8:30 p.m. and the Saturday classes meet from 8:30 a.m. to 3:30 p.m. The second course, EDA 6061, Education Organization and Administration, will meet on Tuesday evenings from 4:30 to 8:30, June 25 to July 31. The **Chipola Indians baseball** team improved to 21-6 with a doubleheader sweep of Flourissant Valley CC on March 7. CJC won the first game, 11-1 and the second, 15-1.

Kyle Olson (4-0) was the winning pitcher in game one. He pitched three innings, striking out three and allowing one unearned run and one hit. Chad Coffee relieved with two scoreless innings.

Leading hitters in game one were Blake Balkcom who was 2 for 4 with two doubles and 2 RBI's. Scott Wearne was 2 for 4 with three RBI's, including a two-run homer in the first. Jonathon Swearingen was two for two with one run and one RBI.

Jason McIntyre picked up his first win of the year in game two. He pitched all five innings, allowing one run and three hits, and striking out two. Balkcom was 2 for 2 with two RBI's. Jose Bautista was 2 for 4 with four RBI's and a three run homer in the third. Philip Slusher was 2 for 2 with four RBI's. Chipola is scheduled to host Grand Rapids on March 8 and 9 at Noon.

The Indians host Meridian, Saturday, March 10 at 5 p.m., and again on Sunday, March 11 at 1 p.m.; Muscatine Monday, March 12 at 4 p.m. The Indians open conference play March 16 at Tallahassee. Chipola hosts Tallahassee Saturday, March 17 at 1 p.m.

The **Lady Indians Softball** team swept Marquette University on March 5, 8-0 and 12-2. Leading hitters in game one were Virginia Spencer who went 2 for 4; Sammi Wilkes who went 2 for 3; and Erin Flater with one homerun. Winning pitcher in game one was Tanya Teague who threw 13

strikeouts and gave up three hits. Winning pitcher for game two was Stephanie Gray who threw 7 strikeouts and allowed one hit. Leading hitters for game two were Shanna Sellers, 2 for 3; Elisha Scott, 2 for 2 and Erin Flater who went 2 for 3 with one homerun.

The Lady Indian's record improved to 21-5 after St. Louis CC forfeited a pair games scheduled for March 7.

The Lady Indians host: Iowa Western (DH), Sunday, March 11 at 1 p.m.; Iowa Central (DH), on Monday, March 12 at 2 p.m.; St. Catherine's (DH) on Wednesday, March 14 at 1; and Iowa Central again on March 15 at 2 p.m. The Lady Indians begin conference play with Pensacola (DH) on Tuesday, March 20 at 4 p.m. in Marianna. 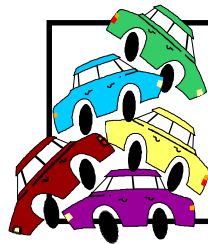

register is two weeks prior to the preferred exam date. Cost of the exam is \$30 and is non-refundable. For more information contact the Testing Office in Building G.



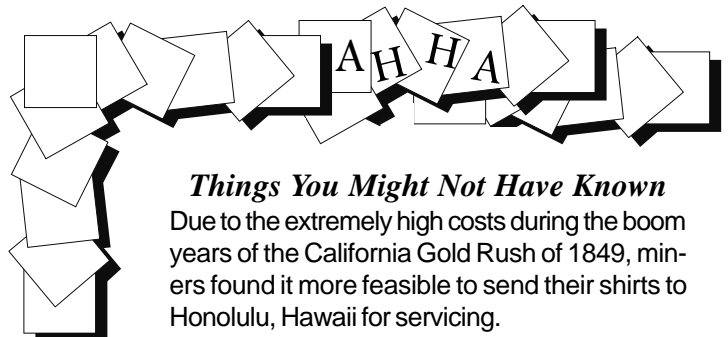
## New Parking Rules
