Fall Music Fest to honor Molineux

Dr. Allen Molineux will be honored at the Chipola Junior College Fall Festival of Music Sunday, Oct. 28, at 2 p.m., in the Chipola Arts Center.

The free event will feature Chipola's three musical ensembles - Chamber Choir, Show Choir, and Rock and Jazz Ensemble in concert. The Chamber Choir will be performing choral literature composed by Molineux, who also directs the Chipola's Jazz Band. A reception in honor of Dr. Molineux will follow the afternoon concert.

Molineux joined the Chipola music faculty in 1988, where he teaches instrumental music and music theory. Since 1971, he has published more than a dozen original compositions. In addition, he has received numerous commissions including one from the Florida Music Teachers Association. His published works range from solos and ensembles for woodwinds, brass and percussion to choral works.

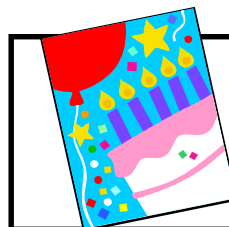
Molineux's "Lachrymae for Brass Quintet" was recently selected for performance at the Society of Composers' Regional V Conference at Ball State University

in Muncie, IN, in conjunction with the school's "Festival 31: New Music 2001." The piece was performed by the Da Camera Brass Quintet which is made up of faculty members at Ball State's School of Music. "Lachrymae," also was selected for performance at The Society of Composers National Conference at Indiana University in 1998.

Molineux's "Free Fancy for Solo Flute" was featured on a 1999 Capstone Records CD by flutist, Grzegorz Olkiewicz. Entitled "Night Thoughts and Fancies," includes selections by eight American composers including Molineux.

He earned a Bachelor's Degree from DePauw University, a Master's Degree from the Eastman School of Music at the University of Rochester and a Doctorate from Florida State University. He previously taught at Barton College, and has taught music in public schools in Pennsylvania and New Jersey.

Molineux also directs the Dothan-based dance band, The Moonlighters. He lives in Dothan with his wife, Bonnie, and their 10-year old son, Lyle.

Arts and humanities seminar is Tuesday at CJC

The Chipola Junior College chapter of Phi Theta Kappa Honor Society will host the satellite seminar, "An Exploration of Community through the Arts and Humanities," Tuesday, Oct. 23, from 6:30 p.m. to 7:30 p.m. in the Continuing Education Conference Center.

Guest speaker Dr. Dan Foran will discuss how community shapes the theme of major artistic and humanitarian works. He also will discuss the ways in which writers, composers, and visual artists have used customs, traditions and celebrations in creating fictional communities, and how imagined communities have become models for real communities.

Foran is a Professor of American Literature and the Director of the Writing Center at the Evergreen State College in Olympia, Washington. He has served as Scholar for the Washington Commission for the Humanities and was named the

Washington Professor of the Year in 1995 by the Carnegie Foundation.

Dr. Foran published the book *Living with Ambiguity* in 1970 and contributed to *Justice and Peace Education: Models for College and University Faculty*. His keynote address "The Pursuit of Happiness: Conflicting Visions and Values," delivered at the 1998 Phi Theta Kappa convention, was published in *Vital Speeches of the Day*. He has also published a number of essays and poems.

The program is the third in a seminar series, entitled, *Customs, Traditions and Celebrations: The Human Drive for Community*. Additional seminars will broadcast at CJC on the following dates: Nov. 6, "The Liveable Urban Community" and Nov. 20, "The Future of Community."

Change in Grade Mailer Practices

Effective Fall Semester, 2001 Chipola will no longer mail student grades out in the form of a grade mailer. Students will be able to access their grades via the internet at www.facts.org. Student grades will be available as soon as they are entered into the school's database.

FACTS stands for Florida Academic Counseling and Tracking System. The State of Florida, the Florida Community College System and the State University System have joined forces to provide students web-based access to unofficial transcripts, degree audits, degree shopping, career information and much more!

How to obtain a copy of your grades and/or unofficial transcript.

1. Visit the FACTS site at **WWW.FACTS.ORG**. You will have several options listed, choose **TRANSCRIPTS**. Then highlight **Chipola Junior College** as your **HOME INSTITUTION**.
2. Enter your **Student ID (Social Security Number)** without hyphens.
3. Enter your **PIN number**. All students enrolled at CJC beginning with Fall 2000 have been assigned an 8 digit PIN according to the following criteria.
 - The first four digits on the PIN equal the last four digits of your SSN.
 - The next two digits of the PIN equal your numeric birth month (i.e. January=01, February=02, December=12, etc.)
 - The last two digits of the PIN equal the numeric YEAR of your birth.
 Example: If your social security number is 123-45-**6789** and your birthday is January 6,

1965 or **01/06/65**, your pin would be 67890165. Your PIN should be valid for the next 6-8 years.

4. Your unofficial transcript will appear, allowing you to look at your courses, grades, and GPA. You may print as many copies as needed.

Students can request official transcripts from the Registrar and Admissions Office by:

- completing a Transcript Request Form in the Registrar's Office, or
- mailing a written letter or printing the Request Form from www.chipola.cc.fl.us and sending to the Registrar and Admissions Office, 3094 Indian Circle, Marianna, Florida 32446, or
- faxing a request to the Registrar's Office at 850-718-2287.

All transcript requests must be made in writing by the student and have the student's signature. Grades cannot be given out over the phone or via e-mail.

Transcripts can be mailed or picked up as indicated on the request, or electronically sent between schools. Chipola does not fax transcripts. Please allow 3 working days for processing.

Students who have **HOLDS** on their records will not be able to view their grades/transcript at FACTS. The **HOLD** information will show and tell the student what kind of **HOLD** he/she has. Once the **HOLD** is removed, the student can see his/her transcript.

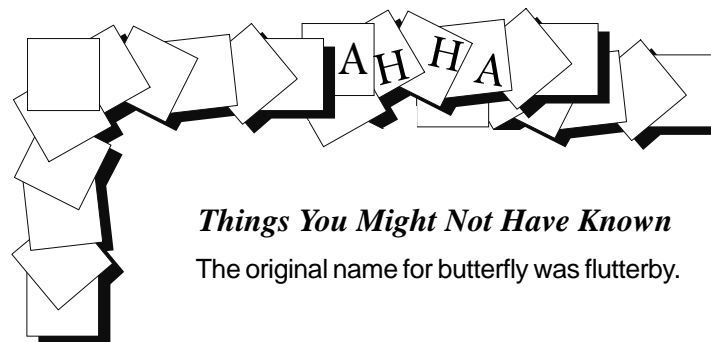
