Chipola to host Panhandle Classic Dec. 4-5

The Indians host a pair of games this weekend in the Panhandle Classic. The Indians play Jefferson College, Friday, at 7 p.m., and Santa Fe, Saturday, at 3 p.m.

Chipola head coach Bret Campbell, says, "We are looking for a very competitive weekend with quality teams invited to the Panhandle Classic. Jefferson College is a talented team out of Louisville, KY, and Santa Fe is always dangerous and well-coached by Chris Mowry. Fans will also get an early look at conference foe Gulf Coast. We hope to continue our progress after winning our last four games but will certainly be tested."

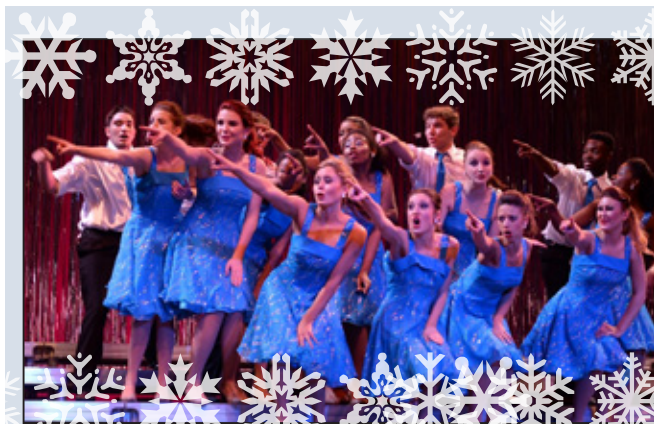
The Indians improved to 6-3 after winning four straight during the Thanksgiving break. Chipola beat ASA, 90-74, on Nov. 29. Patrick Rooks led the Indians with 21 points including five three-pointers. Antwain Johnson scored 14. Eric Lockett had 13 points, with 8 rebounds and 6 assists. Cletrell Pope had 12 rebounds and 9 points.

The Indians trounced State College of Florida (Manatee) 100-70 on Nov. 21. Rooks led Chipola with 25 points. Johnson had 16 points and 5 rebounds. Eric Turner had 12 points and 8 rebounds. Lockett scored 10 points, 14 assists and 8 rebounds. Pope had 16 rebounds and 9 points.

The Indians are ninth in the FCSAA State Poll. Northwest is second. Tallahassee is seventh and Gulf Coast is tenth.

The defending national champion Chipola Lady Indians are 7-1 after recording a pair of wins over the Thanksgiving break. Chipola crushed Santa Fe 90-60 on Nov. 21. Shaliya Fluker led the Lady Indians with 28 points. Barbara Johnson scored 14, with 4 rebounds and 3 steals. Aisha Edwards had 12 points with 7 assists and 3 steals. Cynthia Petke pulled down 14 rebounds and scored 10 points.

Chipola scored a big 89-57 win over Illinois Central on Nov. 20. Edwards led with 23 points. Johnson had 19 points and 7 steals. Fluker scored 17. Raven Baker had 11 points.

FIRST GENERATION SCHOLARSHIP

The Chipola Foundation is accepting applications for the First Generation Scholarship for Spring 2016. Several \$1,000 scholarships will be awarded. Applications must be received in the Foundation office by 4 p.m., Dec. 10. Students must have applied for Federal Pell Grant (FAFSA) and have been determined to be Pell eligible and still have an unmet financial need. Current students must have a 2.0 GPA. New students have a 2.0 high school GPA. The need-based scholarship is available to Florida residents who enroll as degree-seeking students for a minimum of six hours per term. Students must come from a family where neither parent has completed a bachelor’s degree. Students must submit a personal letter and an application—available in the Foundation Office—with all required items by Dec. 10. Call 850-718-2404.
