## Chipola's "Celebrating the Season" is Dec. 10

Individual tickets are now on sale for "Celebrating the Season," the Dec. 10 Chipola Artist Series event featuring Chipola music faculty.

Faculty and a special guest will present classical to modern literature and music of the season. Performers include Dr. Josh Martin, piano; Dr. Daniel Powell, saxophone; Dr. Christine Yoshikawa, piano; Bethany Kiral, soprano; Andrew Stroud, guitar, and guest artist Donna Wissinger, flute.

Tickets may be purchased in Chipola Business Office, or by phone at 850-718-2220, with major credit cards accepted. Tickets also will be on sale the night of the show at 6:30 p.m. in the theatre box office.

Tickets are \$12 for adults, \$8 for ages 18 and under, and \$4 for Chipola students with ID.

The CD, "A Chipola Family Christmas," will be on sale in the lobby of the theatre the night of the concert. Proceeds from the sale of the CD, benefit the Joan B. Stadskev Fine and Performing Arts Scholarship Fund administered through the Chipola Foundation.

Two other events are scheduled in the 2009-10 Artist Series. "Cantus" one of America's finest professional male vocal ensembles will perform **Feb. 1, 2010**. Cantus maintains a vigorous schedule of national tours, subscription concerts in its home of Minneapolis and Saint Paul, as well as educational outreach programs and recording. The *Washington Post* hails the ensemble's sound as having both "exalting finesse" and "expressive power," and refers to their music-making as "spontaneous grace." The ensemble is known for adventurous programming spanning many periods and genres, including chant, Renaissance music, contemporary works, art song, folk, spirituals, world music and pop.

**Sarah Geller, violinist**, will perform March 18, 2010. Geller is described as possessing "the simple, poised, confident stage presence of a seasoned performer," is highly regarded from coast to coast for captivating audiences with her intriguing programming. As a winner of the Artists' International Special Presentation Award, Geller made her Carnegie Hall solo recital debut in 2002 and in 2004 presented a recital on their Alumni Series at New York's



Merkin Concert Hall. Geller performs a wide variety of music from Latin American and flamenco treasures to traditional favorites and unknown gems of mainstream composers. She serves as artist-in-residence at Munson Williams Proctor Arts Institute and as guest artist at Georgetown University.

The Chipola Artist Series is funded through Chipola's Performing Arts Fund, with grants from the National Endowment for the Arts, the Southern Arts Federation, the Florida Division of Cultural Affairs, the Chipola Regional Arts Association and corporate donors.

## Chipola Indians off to a great start

The Chipola Indians are off to a great 6-1 start under first year head coach Jake Headrick. The defending state champions won their first six games of the season before suffering their first misfire on Nov. 28, a 55-53 loss to Howard.

Lashay Page led the Indians with 18 points. Aaron Davis had 15 points. Marvin Fitzgerald had 8.

Howard College (TX) is 11-1 on the year with wins over Chipola, Gulf Coast and Northwest FL.

Howard led 32-23 at the half. Chipola rebounded to take the lead with four minutes left in the game. Lashay Page nearly saved the game with a last-second three that rimmed out. Following his first loss

as a head coach, Chipola's Jake Headrick, said, "It was a great game that went down to the very end. We had several chances to win the game but just couldn't finish it."

Chipola scored a 97-76 win over Mississippi Elite on Nov.

27. Chipola recorded a big 84-77 overtime win at Northwest-Shoals (AL) on **Nov. 15**. Dexter Ellington led the Indians with 27 points. Marvin Fitzgerald pulled down 20 rebounds and scored 16 points. John Taylor scored 14. Sam Grooms had 13. Delwyn Graham had 10 points and 10 rebounds.

The Indians whipped Georgia Perimeter 79-66 on Nov. 14. Chipola trounced Atlanta Metro 87-67, Nov. 13. The Indians scored a big 87-78 win over Beville State on Nov. 12. The Chipola Indians kicked off the 2009-10 season with a 96-74 win over L. B. Wallace on Nov. 6.

Six of the FCCAA's Top 10 teams will be in action in the Chipola Panhandle Classic, Dec. 3-5, including #1 Central Florida, #2 Northwest Florida, #3 Chipola, #4 Tallahassee, #5 Gulf Coast and #6 Santa Fe. Central Florida is also ranked fifth in the NJCAA National Poll. Chipola is tenth in the NJCAA poll.

The Indians take to the road for games in Ocala, Dec. 12-13 and in Panama City, 28-29. The team returns home Jan. 9 to host Gulf Coast in the Conference opener.

## Chipola Lady Indians host Central Florida Dec. 14

The Chipola Lady Indians evened their record to 5-5 by defeating Florida State College of Jacksonville 92-52 on Dec. 1.

The Lady Indians lead 37-22 at the half and shot 48 percent for the game and 58 percent in the second half. Chipola had a good night at the free throw line, connecting on 13 of 18 for 72 percent. Leading scorer was Lindsey Carr with 26. Tykiesha O'Neil had 21. Malesha Peterson had 12 and Bianca Jarrett has 11.

Chipola coach David Lane said, "This was a good win for us to get going in the right direction again after three straight losses. Chipola also came out on top in the first meeting with Jacksonville, 84-75.

The Lady Indians are ninth in the FCCAA State women's poll. Gulf Coast (6-0) is first. Northwest Florida State (7-0) is second. Pensacola (8-1) is third. Tallahassee (7-2) is fifth.

The Lady Indians suffered a 70-61 loss to Hillsborough on Nov. 24. Tykiesha O'Neil had 11 points. Cayla Walker had 9 points. The Lady Indians scored a big 70-63 win over St. Pete on Nov. 23.

Chipola scored a 62-56 win over Monroe (NY) on Nov. 13.

Bianca Jarrett led Chipola with 18 points and 6 rebounds. Lindsey Carr 17 had points and 5 rebounds. Jasmine Shaw scored 14 and pulled down 7 rebounds.

Chipola scored a 72-67 win over Trinity Valley on Nov. 15. O'Neil led Chipola with 23 points and 7 rebounds. Kendra Powell had 14 points and 12 rebounds. Tawatha Tucker scored 11.

The Lady Indians made school history last season defeating Kaskaskia College (IL), 81-74, to finish third in the National Junior College Athletic Association Women's Basketball Tournament—the highest finish in the history of the women's program at Chipola. Chipola finished fourth in 2006 and fifth in 2007.

The Lady Indians host Central Florida Dec. 14 at 6 p.m. in the final home game of 2009. Both Chipola teams open the conference season, Jan. 9, when they host Gulf Coast.

## Chipola to offer H1N1 Immunizations

Chipola College will offer H1N1 (Swine) Flu Immunization for students and employees Monday, Dec. 7, from noon to 4 p.m. and Thursday, Dec. 10, from 8 a.m. to noon. The vaccines will be given in the lobby of the Student Services Building.

The vaccine is free to those who meet certain requirements and no appointment is necessary. Both shot and mist forms of the vaccine will be available.

Persons in the following groups qualify for free immunization: ages 6 months through 24 years; ages 25 through 64 years who are at higher risk because of health disorders or compromised immune systems (asthma, diabetes, heart disease, etc.); pregnant women; those who live with or care for children younger than 6 months of age; and healthcare and emergency medical services personnel.
