Entrance Requirements

This is a limited access, limited enrollment program.

These programs are in the College of Education and require a minimum 2.5 GPA, a minimum score of 20 on the Enhanced ACT, and passing scores on all parts of the CLAST for admission. Previous experience with individuals with disabilities (for example, volunteer work) is strongly suggested. Admissions deadline: Prospective students should complete the departmental application during the first semester of their sophomore year—or after completion of approximately 30 semester hours of course work.

FSU WILL DENY ADMISSION TO ANY STUDENT WHO HAS NOT SATISFIED THE STATE FOREIGN LANGUAGE REQUIREMENT.

FSU requires basic computer proficiency. Students must demonstrate email, Internet, word processing, & spreadsheet skills; demonstrations are monitored by the FSU Computer Science department. Students may take CGS 1060 at CJC to satisfy this requirement.

Applicants must complete a self-disclosure form that requires them to respond to any personal criminal background information; they may also be fingerprinted before student teaching in certain counties.
