FSU requires competency in oral communications for graduation. If students took a speech course in high school or were members of a debate team, they may exempt this requirement. If not, students should take SPC 2600 at CJC to satisfy this requirement.

It is likely that the Information Studies degree will be available ONLY online beginning Fall, 2003. A new major in Information Technology is being proposed for implementation beginning no earlier than Fall, 2004 and probably not until Fall, 2005. This new major will NOT be available online. It will require additional prerequisites and will probably be Limited Access/Limited Enrollment.
