Entrance Requirements

This is a limited access, limited enrollment program. Application deadlines are September 1 for the Spring term and February 1 for Fall term.

Students must have a minimum overall GPA of 3.0 and a minimum science GPA of 3.0. The minimum GPA of students accepted in the past few years has been about a 3.5 overall. Very competitive.

FSU WILL DENY ADMISSION TO ANY STUDENT WHO HAS NOT SATISFIED THE STATE FOREIGN LANGUAGE REQUIREMENT.

FSU requires competency in oral communications for graduation. If students took a speech course in high school or were members of a debate team, they may exempt this requirement. If not, students should take SPC 2600 at Chipola to satisfy this requirement.

FSU requires basic [computer proficiency](#). Students must demonstrate email, Internet, word processing, & spreadsheet skills; demonstrations are monitored by the FSU Computer Science department. CGS 1060, CGS 1100, or EME 2040 will satisfy this requirement.

Students must be able to speak, read and write English proficiently.

Students must pass a Level 2 FBI background check prior to beginning the program. When admitted they must be fingerprinted; prints are submitted to FDLE for processing. If these checks indicate a student will not be able to attend clinicals or receive a license at the end of the program, they are not allowed to begin the program.
