### Entrance Requirements

This is a limited access, limited enrollment program.

A minimum GPA of 2.5 and passing scores on all parts of the CLAST are required for admission to the College of Education. A strong academic preparation is a must! October 15 deadline for Spring term; March 15 deadline for Fall term. All application materials must be on file by the deadline date, not in the mail!

FSU WILL DENY ADMISSION TO ANY STUDENT WHO HAS NOT SATISFIED THE STATE FOREIGN LANGUAGE ADMISSIONS REQUIREMENT.

FSU requires basic [computer proficiency](#). Students must demonstrate email, Internet, word processing, & spreadsheet skills; demonstrations are monitored by the FSU Computer Science department. CGS 1060, CGS 1100, or EME 2040 will satisfy this requirement.

Applicants are chosen based on GPA, relevant experience, and professional promise. Contact FSU College of Education, 115 Stone Bldg., Tallahassee, FL, (850-644-5458), for a complete application packet.

Applicants must complete a self-disclosure form that requires them to respond to any personal criminal background information; they may also be fingerprinted before student teaching in certain counties.
