Entrance Requirements

As a prerequisite for entry into each undergraduate major in the department, students must achieve a grade of "B" or higher in HUN 1201. Individuals who apply for one of the majors but who have not met this prerequisite will be classified as Prerequisites Incomplete (P.I.). Students should apply for admission to this program during the second semester freshman year, as six semesters of clinical athletic training are required. Since access to clinical opportunities are limited, students must complete the following to be admitted: 1) a minimum GPA of 2.5, 2) successful completion of PET 1638 and admittance into PET 1941, and 3) must meet all technical standards for admission. Contact an academic adviser for details.

All junior college/transfer students must complete the same didactic, clinical, and field experiences as resident students. Completion of clinical courses requires a minimum of six semesters. Due to CAAHEP accreditation standards, all athletic training/sports medicine core courses required for the major must be taken at FSU.

FSU WILL DENY ADMISSION TO ANY STUDENT WHO HAS NOT SATISFIED THE STATE FOREIGN LANGUAGE ADMISSIONS REQUIREMENT.

FSU requires competency in oral communications for graduation. If students took a speech course in high school or were members of a debate team, they may exempt this requirement during the FSU admissions process. If not, students should take SPC 2600 at Chipola to satisfy this requirement.

FSU requires basic [computer proficiency](#). Students must demonstrate email, Internet, word processing, & spreadsheet skills; demonstrations are monitored by the FSU Computer Science department. CGS 1060 or EME 2040 will satisfy this requirement.

Students who earns more than five (5) unsatisfactory grades in courses required for the major, at FSU or elsewhere, whether or not repeated, will not be permitted to graduate with a degree in Exercise Science.

² FSU requires an international/diversity course for graduation. The Chipola courses which meet both this requirement and the general education social science requirement GEA 2001, GEA 2002, REL 2300, SYG 1010, WOH 2012, and WOH 2022. It is strongly recommended that one of these courses be completed before earning the AA degree.
