Entrance Requirements

This is a limited access, limited enrollment program.

February 1 is the pharmacy application deadline. All letters of recommendation, personal profile, essay, etc. must be on file at UF by February 1, not in the mail!. PCAT scores required; 80th percentile or above to be competitive. October test date (fall semester of sophomore year) is recommended.

Application & transcripts must be submitted to PharmCAS, a centralized application process system. Their Web address is www.pharmcas.org. Additional Application materials, letter of recommendation forms, and university applications must be downloaded and/or submitted online from the UF Web site at www.cop.ufl.edu/studaff/prepharm.pdf.
