### Entrance Requirements

**This is a limited access program.** Admission to the limited access programs in the College of Business is competitive and depends on availability of faculty and space by discipline. Eligibility for an individual will be based on the following: 1) cumulative grade point average based on all college level work attempted; and 2) satisfactory completion of required prerequisite coursework. Requirements in effect at the time of application to the College (after at least 52 hours have been completed) will determine eligibility for each student. The required GPA may change each year; information regarding the current required GPA is available at [www.cob.fsu.edu](http://www.cob.fsu.edu) (currently 2.9 minimum GPA).

FSU requires competency in oral communications for graduation. If students took a speech course in high school or were members of a debate team, they may exempt this requirement during the FSU admissions process. If not, students may take SPC 2600 at Chipola to satisfy this requirement. FSU does have a required business core course (GEB 3213) that meets the SPC requirement.

**FSU will deny admission to any student who has not satisfied the state foreign language admissions requirement.**

It is strongly recommended that one of these courses be completed before earning the AA degree.

<sup>5</sup> Choose 4 hours from the following: AML 2010, AML 2020, ENL 2012, ENL 2022, ENC 1133, HUM 2216, HUM 2233, or SPT 2521.

<sup>6</sup> Not required for accounting majors, required for all other business majors.
