A minimum of 60 semester credit hours is needed to graduate from Chipola College. The pre-professional curriculum is approved for 72 hours. The Chipola total of 75 is created by the one additional hour in each of three classes: ENC 1101, ENC 1102, and CHM 2210/2210L.

Entrance Requirements

This is a limited access, limited enrollment program. Program applications are accepted between August 1 and January 15 for admission for fall of next academic year. The entire application packet must be completed and on file with UF by the deadline. PCAT scores must be at the 80th percentile or above to be competitive.

UF WILL DENY ADMISSION TO ANY STUDENT WHO HAS NOT SATISFIED THE STATE FOREIGN LANGUAGE ADMISSIONS REQUIREMENT.
