# APPLICATION INSTRUCTIONS FOR THE FIRST GENERATION IN COLLEGE SCHOLARSHIP

#### FUNDS CAN ONLY BE USED FOR SPRING 2021 SEMESTER

### THERE WILL BE SEVERAL PARTIAL SCHOLARSHIPS AWARDED FOR USE TOWARD TUITION AND/OR BOOKS FOR CHIPOLA COLLEGE SPRING 2021 SEMESTER

#### **DEADLINE TO APPLY IS NOVEMBER 18, 2020**

#### INCOMPLETE APPLICATIONS WILL NOT BE CONSIDERED

The First Generation in College Scholarship is a need based scholarship to <u>Florida</u> residents. The student must enroll as an undergraduate, degree-seeking student for a minimum of six hours per term at Chipola College. <u>The student must meet the eligibility requirements for demonstrated financial need and must come from a family where neither parent has earned a bachelor's degree. If the student regularly resides with only one parent who provides the majority support, that one parent must not have completed a bachelor's degree for the student to be eligible.</u>

In order to apply for a First Generation in College Scholarship you must complete a First Generation in College application and mail it in or place in the drop box with all of the required items outlined on the attached application to the Foundation Office by November 18, 2020. **Do not turn in the application until all of the required items have been attached to the application.** 

Students just entering college must have a <u>2.0 or better grade point average at high school graduation</u> or earned GED to qualify for this scholarship. <u>Students that have previously been enrolled in college must have both a cumulative and semester grade point average of 2.0 or better</u>. A copy of the student's high school transcript must be submitted if the Fall 2020 semester is the first semester of college enrollment. If you do not have at least 24 college credit hours, submit both high school and college transcripts. You may obtain unofficial Chipola transcripts online at <u>www.mychipola.edu</u>.

In order to apply, applicants must meet the eligibility requirements in section 1009.50, Florida Statutes, for demonstrated financial need for the Florida Public Student Assistance Grant, by submitting the Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA). Applicants must still have an unmet financial need to be eligible to receive additional scholarship funds and have an Expected Family Contribution (EFC) that is 8,566 or lower for 2020-2021.

Applications must be received in the Foundation office by 4 p.m. on November 18, 2020. Any application received after the deadline, regardless of postmark date, will be declined. After the deadline the Scholarship Committee will review and rank applications. You will receive a contract in the mail if you are awarded scholarship funds. You are required to submit the following items with your application:

- 1. A copy of your most recent high school and/or college transcript. Must show a minimum of at least one year's college work (minimum of 24 college credit hours earned) if submitting a college transcript. If you have earned less than 24 college credit hours you must submit both a high school and a college transcript. Chipola College transcripts may be obtained online from <a href="www.mychipola.edu">www.mychipola.edu</a>. Transcripts should show grades through high school graduation or most recent semester completed, or proof of GED. Your transcript(s) must be turned in with this application as the college cannot generate your high school transcript. You must have a minimum of 2.0 grade point average from high school, and if you have had previous college work, you must have a 2.0 cumulative and semester grade point average for last semester enrolled in order to apply.
- 2. A letter must accompany this application containing the following information:
  - ❖ a little about yourself and your educational plans
  - why you feel you need help to attend college
  - your school and community involvement and any honors
  - \* extenuating circumstances you wish to be considered by the scholarship committee.
  - Statement confirming that parents have not earned a college bachelor's degree
- 3. Student must have applied for Federal Pell Grant (FAFSA) and been determined Pell eligible and still have an unmet financial need and have an Expected Financial Need (EFC) of 8,566 or lower for 2020--2021.
- 4. Complete both pages of the application and return to the Foundation Office by November 18, 2020 at 4 p.m.
