## ELIGIBILITY REQUIREMENTS

1. Must be an eligible student officially enrolled in grades 6-12 in a public, private, virtual, or home education program within Chipola's 5-county district.
2. Must have approval of high school principal or designee.
3. Must have official scores all sections of ACT, PERT, CLT, or SAT
4. Must meet qualifying READING score\*
5. Must have 3.0 high school GPA in 5 high school credits.

## Admissions Requirements

- Complete Chipola College online application at [www.chipola.edu](http://www.chipola.edu)
- Counselor or parent submits
  - Official high school transcript with official test scores and qualifying high school 3.0 GPA in 5 high school credits
  - Official test scores on ALL sections of ACT, PERT, CLT, or SAT with qualifying READING score
  - Principles of Participation signed by parent and student
  - Course Voucher
  - Public/Private School Eligibility Form OR
  - Homeschool Articulation Agreement

Once cleared in Admissions, student will receive an acceptance email from Admissions with student ID, username, and password instructions.

## PARTICIPATION STANDARDS

### Attendance:

Dual-Enrollment students attending classes on campus must adhere to the college's and instructors' attendance policies. The only excused absences are those sanctioned by the college. High school activities are not excused absences for DE students.

### Grades:

Must maintain a minimum, cumulative college 2.0 GPA to remain eligible in the DE program.

### Withdrawal:

Students must follow their district's withdrawal policy and have approval from their guidance counselor to withdraw from college coursework. Students may not repeat courses in which a W, D, or F is earned until after high school graduation.
