2 Electives should include course work in foreign language, computers, statistics, speaking and writing courses, or courses to meet the business language option above.
3 FSU requires 6 hrs. of international/diversity courses. If you complete an AA degree before transferring, FSU only requires 3 hrs. of international/diversity coursework. Chipola courses that meet this requirement include AMH 2091/2093, ARH 1000, ASH 1044, GEA 2001/2002, REL 2300, SYG 1010, and THE 1000.
4 For students desiring a BS, completion of these courses (ECO 2013, ECO 2023, and STA 2023) meets the business language requirement.
5 For students desiring a BA, THIS MAJOR REQUIRES FOREIGN LANGUAGE THROUGH THE 2220 LEVEL.
6 FSU requires one Natural Science course with a Lab to be completed before graduation. This is not an admission requirement.
7 Students enrolled in AA, AS, or BS degree programs must complete the State of Florida's Civic Literacy requirement. See catalog or contact an Academic Advisor for more information. Requirements: FCLE AND one course from POS 2041 or AMH 2020 or (AMH 2010 beginning Fall 2024).

FSU requires a Digital Literacy Competency Course: CGS 1060 meets this requirement.
