Entrance Requirements

Due to the competitive nature and restricted capacity, the ATEP is considered a limited access program, as granted by the Florida Board of Governors. Please review the most recent version of this catalog and speak to your academic adviser. Portfolio materials are due to the APK advising office (190E Florida Gym) on or before February 1 of the sophomore year. UF may admit up to 20 deserving individuals a year, but reserves the right to admit fewer students. Minimum 3.0 GPA.

The admissions process requires a portfolio which must be completed prior to enrollment in the ATEP curriculum (Summer B). Admission can be denied if requirements are not fulfilled prior to initial program enrollment. Application packets are available October 15 and due on or before February 1 before the summer you plan to attend. Check the [UF website](#) for the LONG list of requirements. Candidates must complete an interview with the athletic training steering committee, complete all common prerequisites as outlined by the Florida Board of Governors for Athletic Training Education programs in the State University System (transcript and/or advising form), complete at least 60 credit hours or the AA degree, hold a cumulative GPA of 3.0 or higher (advising form), and earn a B or higher in anatomy and physiology I and II (advising form).

All first time in college (Fall 2014 and beyond) students are required to successfully complete two years of the same foreign language in high school or two semesters of the same foreign language at the college level before the associate degree is awarded. Home School students must demonstrate competency through competency testing.
