Entrance Requirements to the Bachelor of Science program:

To be admitted to the BS program, students must have an Associate in Arts degree or at least 60 semester credit hours of postsecondary education with completion of the Chipola College general education requirement from a regionally accredited institution, OR an Associate in Science in Business Administration degree and completion of the Chipola College general education requirement from a regionally accredited institution. Students must have completed the state-mandated business common prerequisites and earned an overall GPA of 2.0 in lower-division coursework.

All first time in college (Fall 2014 and beyond) students are required to successfully complete two years of the same foreign language in high school or two semesters of the same foreign language at the college level before the associate degree is awarded. Home School students must demonstrate competency through competency testing.

All students must complete the required English and mathematics courses with a grade of "C" or higher.
