### Entrance Requirements

A minimum GPA of 2.5 is required. Applicants must have an AA degree and present passing scores on all sections of the general knowledge portion of the FTCE for admission to the Baccalaureate program.

Applicants must complete a self-disclosure form that requires them to respond to any personal criminal background information; they must also be fingerprinted and submit a background check.

**All first time in college (Fall 2014 and beyond) students are required to successfully complete two years of the same foreign language in high school or two semesters of the same foreign language at the college level before the associate degree is awarded. Home School students must demonstrate competency through competency testing.**
