## Elementary Education

### Transfer Institution: Florida State University

#### Entrance Requirements

**This is a limited access, limited enrollment program.**

Students are formally admitted into this major for the Fall only. Applicants to Elementary Education are selected on the basis of multiple criteria: GPA, SAT/ACT scores and rigor of lower-division course work. Students should achieve a passing score on each section of the General Knowledge section of the Florida Teacher Certification Exam. Achieve an overall GPA of 2.5. **Transfer students should submit department application by February 15th.**

All first time in college (Fall 2014 and beyond) students are required to successfully complete two years of the same foreign language in high school or two semesters of the same foreign language at the college level before the associate degree is awarded. Home School students must demonstrate competency through competency testing.

FSU requires basic computer proficiency. EME 2040 will satisfy this requirement. Must earn a grade of "C" or higher. Applicants must be fingerprinted and pass a security clearance prior to admission into the program.
