Entrance Requirements

A minimum GPA of 2.5 is required. Students are formally admitted into this major for the Fall Term Only. Department application must be submitted by April 1st. Applicants must present passing scores on the general knowledge section of the FTCE by the end of their third term for admission to the College of Education. All first time in college (Fall 2014 and beyond) students are required to successfully complete two years of the same foreign language in high school or two semesters of the same foreign language at the college level before the associate degree is awarded. Home School students must demonstrate competency through competency testing. FSU requires basic computer proficiency; EME 2040 will satisfy this requirement. Grade of "C" or higher is required.

- Twelve (12) hours of Gordon Rule Writing are required. In addition to ENC 1101 and ENC 1102, choose from the following courses to complete the 12 hour requirement: AML 2010, AML 2020, ENL 2012, or ENL 2022. Must be completed with a "C" or higher.
- Upon completion of an AA degree before transferring, FSU only requires 3 hrs. of international/diversity coursework(EDF2085).
- Must choose one course from the following: AST 1002, BSC 1005, BSC 2010, BSC 2085, CHM 1045, ESC 1000, EVR 1001, PHY 1053C, PHY 2048C, PSC 1121.
- Must choose one course from the following: MAC 1105, MAC 1311, MGF 1106, MGF 1107, STA 2023. FSU strongly recommends MAC 1105 and STA 2023.
- If student has taken 2 credits of Foreign Language in high school then choose elective.
- Must choose one course from the following: AMH 2020, ECO 2013, POS 2041, PSY 2012, or SYG 1000.
- Choose one of the following: ARH 1000, MUL 2010, THE 1000.
- FSU requires one Natural Science course w/ Lab to be completed before graduation. Must be completed with a grade of C or higher. This is not an admission requirement.
- All first-time-in-college students (Fall 2018 and beyond) are required to demonstrate competency in civic literacy through one of the following options:** 1) successfully passing either POS 2041 American Federal Government or AMH 2020 American History Since 1865, or 2) achieving the standard score on AP Government and Politics: United States, AP United States History or CLEP: American Government.
