#### Entrance Requirements

A minimum 2.5 GPA on all work attempted. Check UF website for deadlines and other specific requirements. All first-time-in-college (Fall 2014 and beyond) students are required to successfully complete two years of the same foreign language in high school or two semesters of the same foreign language at the college level before the associate degree is awarded. Home School students must demonstrate competency through competency testing.

**The College of Journalism and Communications at UF specifically requires two semesters of college-level foreign language. SPN 1120 and SPN 1121 would fulfill this requirement. Students may also fulfill this requirement by completing three (3) of the following five (4) courses: ACG 2021, ACG 2071, EME 2040, STA 2023.**
