A minimum of 60 semester credit hours is needed to graduate from Chipola College. The additional hours are required to complete the pre-professional curriculum.

Entrance Requirements

This is a limited access, limited enrollment program. Program applications are accepted between July 15 and February 1 of the following year. Check [UF website](#) and [PharmCAS](#) for complete application information and deadlines. The entire application packet must be completed and on file with UF by the deadline. A competitive Science GPA is 3.0-4.0 for in-state students and competitive PCAT score for in-state students is a 70th–99th percentile.

All first time in college (Fall 2014 and beyond) students are required to successfully complete two years of the same foreign language in high school or two semesters of the same foreign language at the college level before the associate degree is awarded. Home School students must demonstrate competency through competency testing.

Plan to take BCH 4024 Introduction to Biochemistry and Molecular Biology and MCB 3020 Basic Biology of Microorganisms in the summer at UF before admission into the Pharmacy program. Contact COP Pharm.D. admissions advisor at least two semesters prior to the semester students need to take these courses to insure they are registered in time to attend them.
