Entrance Requirements

A minimum cumulative GPA of 2.0 and a 2.5 minimum GPA in tracking courses is required for admission. This program, in the College of Liberal Arts & Sciences, requires additional humanities, foreign language, and natural science courses.

All first time in college (Fall 2014 and beyond) students are required to successfully complete two years of the same foreign language in high school or two semesters of the same foreign language at the college level before the associate degree is awarded. Home School students must demonstrate competency through competency testing.

The CLAS at UF requires 8-10 hours of college level foreign language for graduation.

The College of Liberal Arts and Sciences at UF does not accept most CLEP credit for general education or basic distribution course work. Check the UF catalog/website for more information.
