Entrance Requirements

A minimum cumulative GPA of 2.8 and a minimum 2.75 GPA on all attempts in tracking courses are required for admission. This program is in the College of Liberal Arts and Sciences and requires additional humanities, foreign language, and natural science courses.

All first time in college (Fall 2014 and beyond) students are required to successfully complete two years of the same foreign language in high school or two semesters of the same foreign language at the college level before the associate degree is awarded. Home School students must demonstrate competency through competency testing.

The CLAS requires students to have 8-10 hours of college level foreign language to graduate. SPN 1120 and SPN 1121 Meet this requirement.

The UF College of Liberal Arts and Sciences does not accept most CLEP credit. Check UF catalog/website for more information.
