Entrance Requirements

This is now a limited access program. Applicants must meet the following requirements: 1) must submit the BSW application available from the department (includes a current resume, personal statement, and transcript), 2) have an overall GPA of 3.0 or higher, 3) have completed an AA degree, 4) have completed all five of the common prerequisite courses with a B or higher.

All first time in college (Fall 2014 and beyond) students are required to successfully complete two years of the same foreign language in high school or two semesters of the same foreign language at the college level before the associate degree is awarded. Home School students must demonstrate competency through competency testing.

FSU requires competency in oral communications for graduation. If students took a speech course in high school or were members of a debate team, they may exempt this requirement during the FSU admissions process. **If not, students should take SPC 2608 at Chipola to satisfy this requirement. SOW 3350 will meet this requirement at FSU.**

FSU requires basic computer proficiency. CGS 1060 or CGS 1100 will satisfy this requirement. Must earn a grade of "C" or higher.
FSU requires one Natural Science course with a Lab to be completed before graduation. This is not an admission requirement.
