Entrance Requirements

Admission to the program is for fall semester only. Students must apply for admission to the program by March 1 each year. Separate applications must be filed. Transfer students seeking admission must apply to the department by March 1st and meet the following minimum requirements: 1) meet the general criteria for transfer into an FSU degree-granting program, 2) complete an A.A. degree, 3) complete the prerequisites courses, and 4) achieve a minimum overall 2.75 GPA. Admission is competitive. Preference will be given to students with the highest GPAs as well as required coursework.

- FSU requires 6 hrs. of international/diversity courses. If you complete an AA degree before transferring, FSU only requires 3 hrs. of international/diversity coursework. Chipola courses that meet this requirement include AMH 2091/2093, ASH 1044, GEA 2001/2002, REL 2300, SYG 1010, and THE 1000.
- Students must complete nine (9) hours of coursework with any combination of the following prefixes: ACG, CGS, GEB, MAR, ORI, PET, SPC, and or STA.
- Students must demonstrate computer literacy with a "C" or better in CGS 1060.
- FSU requires competency in oral communications for graduation. If you took a speech course in high school or was on the debate team you may exempt this requirement during the FSU admissions process. If not, **take SPC 2608 at Chipola to satisfy this requirement.**
- If student has taken 2 credits of Foreign Language in high school then choose elective. All first time in college (Fall 2014 and beyond) students are required to successfully complete two years of the same foreign language in high school or two semesters of the same foreign language at the college level before the associate degree is awarded. Home School students must demonstrate competency through competency testing.
- FSU requires one Natural Science course with a Lab to be completed before graduation. This is not an admission requirement.**
- All first-time-in-college students (Fall 2018 and beyond) are required to demonstrate competency in civic literacy through one of the following options:**
 - successfully passing either POS 2041 American Federal Government or AMH 2020 American History Since 1865, or 2) achieving the standard score on AP Government and Politics: United States, AP United States History or CLEP: American Government.
