#### Entrance Requirements

Minimum 2.0 GPA required, with 2.2 GPA in critical tracking prerequisites. In-residence program admission deadline is March 1 for fall and September 15 for Spring. The 2+2 online program is available to Florida-based transfer students who have not previously enrolled at UF. Admission deadlines are November 1 for Spring, March 1 for Summer, and June 1 for Fall.

All first time in college (Fall 2014 and beyond) students are required to successfully complete two years of the same foreign language in high school or two semesters of the same foreign language at the college level before the associate degree is awarded. Home School students must demonstrate competency through competency testing.
