#### Entrance Requirements

A minimum GPA of 2.0 is required with a minimum GPA of 2.5 in critical tracking courses listed below. The program normally begins in the Summer I term at UF. Students who begin in the fall or spring terms may be at a disadvantage academically and may find it necessary to extend their residence at UF because of course sequencing. Check with UF for most current information.

Admission Deadline: Check UF website.

All first time in college (Fall 2014 and beyond) students are required to successfully complete two years of the same foreign language in high school or two semesters of the same foreign language at the college level before the associate degree is awarded. Home School students must demonstrate competency through competency testing.
